ASO Visual Abstract: Poor Access to Mental Healthcare is Associated with Worse Postoperative Outcomes among Patients with Gastrointestinal Cancer

This study (<https://doi.org/10.1245/s10434-023-14374-7>) highlights the importance of access to psychiatry in patients with gastrointestinal cancer undergoing surgery via geospatial analysis. Patients with lower access to psychiatric

services had worse postoperative outcomes. Policymakers should prioritize improving mental health screening and access to psychiatric services.
