Conference on Memory Improvement: Implications for Memory Theory Union College, Schenectady, New York October 18-19, 1990

The second in a series of conferences sponsored by the Union College Department of Psychology, underwritten by the department's Ichabod Spencer Fund and the Pew Foundation, will be held at the college on October 18 and 19, 1990. Union College is located in Schenectady, New York, about 10 miles from Albany, New York.
