

## EDITORIAL

This issue of *Behavior Research Methods, Instruments, & Computers* is dedicated to the 15th annual meeting of the Society for Computers in Psychology, held in Boston, Massachusetts, November 21, 1985. The one-day conference included presentations divided among three symposia, a presidential address, an invited address, and five paper sessions. Opportunities for public domain software swaps also were provided.
