Appendix A: Sample Weights

Survey of Environmentalism 1995 consists of 1 sample drawn from the general Norwegian population and 12 samples drawn from 12 environmental organizations. Technically, the 12 organizational populations are subpopulations of the general Norwegian population. The main distinction therefore runs between the general population sample and the 12 organizational samples. Our primary research interest concurs with this distinction. The other research interest is the difference among the four types of environmental organization.

The initial selection of the 12 organizations, from each of which 1 sample was drawn, was carried out with a view to represent the environmental field in the best possible way (e.g., year of foundation, organizational style, as well as environmental and ecological agenda). Including any other organization in our sample would not, we argue, add anything significantly to our understanding of our unique and anomalous case. Consequently, we treat the 12 organizations as the population of environmental organizations. It follows that each sample should be of equal weight. We therefore developed weights for respondents in each of the 12 samples so that each organization counts as 1 in the analysis (see Table A). Weights are used in all analyses in which organizations are units of observation.
