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Preface and Acknowledgments

When travelling with my family on a ferry from Tarifa in Spain to Tangier in Morocco, in the summer of 2018, we encountered a group of African refugees who were being taken to shore by armed guards who had been patrolling the area out at sea. Upon returning three days later we saw the refugees still held captured under armed guard on a boat in the harbour—before being returned back across the Strait of Gibraltar. We, however, sailed right through and easily re-entered Spain on our European passports. I remember the difficulty of trying to explain this situation to my twelve-year-old daughter, who couldn't contemplate the calamity she was witnessing. This book is partially an attempt to explain the politics that over the last half-century resulted in this state of affairs.

Over the last two decades I have studied both nationalism and populism and published several books and articles on the separate phenomena. Although the two should not be conflated, the current era has seen the convergence of both populism and nationalism. In previous publications I have developed the concept of *nationalist* populism. However, when dealing with politics that primarily point to dangerous outsiders, my focus here is on the *nativist* kind, which I maintain has turned into a separate *Neo-Nationalism* spreading across Europe and America.

This research has benefitted from interactions with many colleagues in several academic fields, for example in the EU-funded COST action, Comparative Analysis of Conspiracy Theories (COMPACT). I thank all my colleagues in the network for thought-provoking discussions and for exposing me to some of the most pristine research in the fields of both
